The Moving Wall

The Germantown American Legion Post 1 is proud to host the Vietnam Moving Wall™ (TMW) on September 1-5, 2016, Labor Day Weekend.

On Sept. 1, 2016, The Moving Wall™ will arrive in Germantown, Wisconsin. It will be on display at Kennedy Middle School athletic field through Labor Day, Sept. 5. The Moving Wall™ is a half-size replica of the Washington, DC Vietnam Veterans Memorial and has been touring the country for 30-plus years. Since it was built in 1984 it has been in more than 1,300 cities across the United States.

There are currently 58,307 names on The Wall, 14 of which are from Washington County including two from Germantown, four from Hartford, three from Kewaskum and five from West Bend. We will be honoring all 14 fallen heroes and inviting their families to participate in the five-day event. Our goal is to attract as many visitors during the Labor Day weekend, as there are names on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall.

Along with hosting The Moving Wall™ we are also bringing the Healing Field®, a visual display of hundreds to thousands of American flags. American Huey 369 from Peru, IN, will be present along with membership rides. Vietnam era veterans will experience a unique “Welcome Home” parade similar to the style of Honor Flight parades. The American Legion Post 1 banquet hall will be transformed into a hands-on Vietnam era educational experience, it will be open one week prior to The Moving Wall™ visit. And a full-color keepsake book, will be available for sale documenting the local ties to The Moving Wall™ and much more.

The Moving Wall™ Display

When The Moving Wall™ arrives to Germantown and is ready to be taken to the display site, it will get a proper escort from our American Legion riders, as well as some other groups. Together all the riders will make a grand entrance by leading the The Moving Wall™ through town with the highest level of respect to the display site. Once it is all set up, the Moving Wall™ will be available for five days which will also include ceremonies and other appropriate events. There is no cost to attend anything and it will be available for viewing 24/7 rain or shine. There will also be mental health counselors available, as well as medical assistance in case of an emergency.



The Healing Field® Display

The Healing Field® display is the premiere program of Colonial Flag Foundation. It consists of a decidedly visual display of American Flags wherein each flag represents remembrance, support, and honor for the men and women who have served our country and for those that paid the ultimate price for our freedom. This Field of Flags will be displayed for five days. Anyone can purchase a flag, and write a customized message on the tag, for someone who has been in the military or is currently serving. Several different boy/girl scout troops will work together to put up all of the flags before The Moving Wall™ is set up. We anticipate displaying between 800 - 2,500 flags. "Welcome Home" Parade



Vietnam Era Educational Hall

The Post 1 Banquet Hall will be transformed and open for visitors one week prior to The Moving Wall™ visit, and then stay open while the Wall is in Germantown. Upon entering the Vietnam Era Educational Hall, you will be presented with military dog tags and mimicked military papers of a living Vietnam Veteran or from one of the soldiers names on the Wall from WI, to start your hands-on experience. Once you are in the hall you will be guided through



different stations and times of the war. This creative transformation is being researched and developed by a team of talented individuals who will capture details from the Vietnam war and bring it to life, including a full display of photos taken from a Vietnam photojournalist. The purpose of this experience is to educate youth especially, about the Vietnam war and to give Vietnam era veterans the opportunity to tell their stories through this unique experience. The hope is to bring healing to Veterans and a better understanding to youth as to why thousands of names are on the Wall and what each soldier sacrificed for our freedoms we have today. We aim to keep this as true to the Vietnam era as possible, including much of what was going on during that time such as protests, the civil rights movement, etc., while keeping in mind the age groups and appropriateness. This is a FREE event however, food and a full-color keepsake book will be available for purchase.

Full-color Keepsake Book

A full-color keepsake book, will be available for sale documenting the local ties to The Moving Wall™. In this book, you will be captivated by the stories told and information unfolded. Your heart-strings will be pulled by photos taken from a photojournalist who traveled to the Vietnam War and lived to tell about the images. You will get an exclusive and unique look at the 14 names of the soldiers on the wall from Washington County, researched by a Milwaukee journalism class. All names on The Wall from Wisconsin will be honored. History from Washington, DC Vietnam Veterans Memorial will be shared, along with what sparked the idea and motivation behind the Moving Wall™. Best kept secrets and stories will be told from the viewpoint of a few Vietnam Veterans including; an infantryman and tunnel rat. The colorful chronology of the Vietnam war, including the sound of hope from the Huey Helicopter, will have it's place. This keepsake book, will also touch on what was going on back home in Wisconsin with the student protests, burning of draft cards, confrontation with army recruiters, and more. It will also serve as a reminder as to what "We The People" and "Free Enterprise" means for the United States, and all who live in this great nation.
